The Public Art Archive™ (PAA) is a free and continually growing online and mobile database of completed public artworks throughout the U.S. and abroad. By uniting records from public art organizations and artists into one comprehensive resource, PAA aims to provide universal access to the complex stories that characterize public artworks not as static objects, but as dynamic, interconnected keepers of history, context and meaning. PAA's mission "to make public art more public" has guided the program's growth into one of the largest active databases of public art.

The Public Art Archive offers a suite of free and low-cost resources for the documentation, management, and exploration of public art built specifically for the public art field. The Public Art Archive helps public art administrators address field-wide gaps in documentation and take advantage of tools, built and supported by public art professionals, with workflows tailored to public art collection management.

Have You Seen My Public Art? Map, 2nd Edition

The PAA unveiled its second edition of its celebratory Have You Seen My Public Art? Map in Fall 2022. The map, illustrated by artist Kara Fellows, includes 144 artworks across all 50 states created by over 176 unique artists and studios within the last 10 years.

This We Believe: A Citywide Mural Project from Mural Arts Philadelphia

This We Believe: In 2008 Mural Arts Philadelphia launched This We Believe, its first Citywide Mural Project. The goal was ambitious: to create a mural that would represent Philadelphia as the complex city that it is. From beginning to end, This We Believe was about meaningful collaboration among Philadelphians with varied perspectives. Only one portion of the mural has found a long term home, and this exhibition is a way to continue sharing the mural and the significant process behind its creation.
