<b>Persuasion</b>	<p>The project <b>does not convince the audience</b> that the local environmental problem is <b>important and concerning</b>, or that the <b>root causes</b> are <b>accurate and connected</b>, or that the suggested actions are <b>meaningful and effective</b>.</p>	<p>The project convinces the audience that the local environmental problem is <b>important and concerning</b>, that the <b>root causes</b> are <b>accurate and connected</b>, and that the suggested actions are <b>meaningful and effective</b>.</p>	<p>The project meets the standard for <b>persuasion</b>, <b>and</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>... describes <b>how</b> and <b>why</b> the suggested actions will <b>improve</b> the local environment.</li><li>... makes it <b>easy and fun</b> for the audience to take action.</li></ul>
<b>Impact</b>	<p>The project <b>does not invite the audience</b> to take action, or:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>... the actions suggested by the project are <b>vague and not specific</b>, or</li><li>... the actions address the problem's <b>symptoms</b>, but not its <b>root causes</b>.</li></ul>	<p>The project invites the audience to take at least one <b>specific, reasonable action</b>.</p> <p>The actions address the <b>root causes</b> of the problem, and not just the <b>symptoms</b> of the problem.</p>	<p>The project meets the standard for <b>effectiveness</b>, <b>and</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>... suggests a <b>sequence of actions</b>, including some that are simple and some that are more complex.</li><li>... includes a way for the audience to <b>share</b> the impacts of their action steps, creating positive <b>ripple effects</b>.</li></ul>
